General Information

WHEN: Thursday, August 24, 2006, through Sunday, August 27, 2006. Registration begins at 9:45 a.m. on Thursday. The gates will be open at 9:00 a.m. to allow cars to bring luggage to cabins. Registration will end at 11:45 a.m. **NO EXCEPTIONS!!** All must be registered and in attendance at the Flag Raising at 12:00 noon.

On Sunday, Brunch concludes at 11:00 a.m. Campers may leave only after their cabin and surrounding area has been checked out for cleanliness. All Campers must depart by 1:00 p.m.

LOCATION: Camp Lake Hubert (CLH) is located 10 miles north of Brainerd, just off Highway 371. Turn east on Nashway Road at mile marker **42**. Go one mile and turn left into camp. Look for the Sign!

REFUNDS: No refunds will be given after August 1, 2006, unless requested in writing and having a physician's signature included. OBJECTIVE OF CAMP: For Job's Daughters members and adults to become better acquainted, enjoy and renew old friendships, and make new ones. We want all campers to have FUN! **Please respect the feelings, rights, and property of others.** Let the Golden Rule be our Guide.

MEMBERS: All Job's Daughters must be registered and remain at Camp until its conclusion unless approved by Camp Chair Vicki Toepper.

CHAPERONES/ADULTS: Chaperones/adults must be 20 years of age or older and approved by the Bethel Guardian Council. Current Grand Bethel Officers, Representatives and Choir Members are not eligible to be a chaperone even though they have reached their Majority. Because the men are housed in a separate area of Camp, the Camp Committee requests a minimum of one female chaperone for every five girls.

Extra adults, both male and female, are encouraged to attend camp, share the fun and assist with camp activities. If your Bethel cannot find enough chaperones, please contact the Camp Chair, Vicki Toepper e-mail: vtoepper@commonbond.org and she will see what arrangements can be made.

TRANSPORTATION: Bethels are responsible for their own transportation to and from Camp.

PARKING: During arrival and departure, please follow the directions of the Camp Committee in the parking lots. If you are a first-time camper, a guide will be provided at the Camp gate to lead you to your cabin. All vehicles must be kept on the blacktop roads. All fire lanes must be kept open and free of vehicles. Immediately after unloading, vehicles are to be parked in the lot by the entrance gate or in the overflow lot by the barn. The office lot is reserved for emergency vehicles and the Camp Committee. Remember you can unload luggage quicker by arriving early – gates will be open at 9:00 a.m. and registration begins at 9:45 a.m.

WHAT TO BRING: Please label all items. Leave valuables at home!

Clothing appropriate for camping, (hot, cold, cool and/or rainy weather).

Sleeping bag/bedding and pillow.

Appropriate shoes for sports, walking, running, etc (shoes other than sandals!!)

Towels, washcloths, personal hygiene items

Mosquito repellent

Flashlight and batteries. This is a MUST! Make sure the batteries are good.

Camera, film, batteries (names on all cameras)

Swimsuit, beach towel and sunscreen

Spending money for Camp Store (clothing, pop, water, candy, etc.)

Sporting equipment – bats, balls, and softball glove. **Please label items.**

Other items needed for skit night, costumes, etc.

If you want to sit in a chair at the various events, bring your own lawn chair!

WHAT TO LEAVE AT HOME: Please DO NOT bring refrigerators, large hairdryers, computers, etc. We ask you to understand that the cabins are not prepared to handle the extra electrical load of extra appliances. We also ask you not to bring your own pop, etc. but purchase it from the Camp Store. This helps to keep the cost of camp down. Please leave all expensive jewelry and things with sentimental value at home. **If cell phones are brought to camp, we ask that they are left in the car or given to a chaperone while at camp.**

CHECK OUT: You will receive a check-out list in your camp packet when you arrive on Thursday. Please look over the list before Sunday so that you can have your cabin and surrounding area clean and ready to go after Flag lowering on Sunday. When your area is clean and has been inspected you will receive a pass for your vehicles to exit camp. Everyone must depart by 1:00 PM.
